[Texas Railroad Commission- Office of Pipeline Safety](#): The Texas Railroad Commission is the state regulatory agency responsible for pipeline [damage prevention](#), safety programs and reporting damage to pipelines that transmit hazardous materials including oil and gas.

[Texas One Call Board](#)- The purpose of the One-Call Board of Texas (OCB) is to establish and operate a "one-call" excavation safety and underground facility damage prevention notification system designed to provide excavators with the capability of making only "one-call" prior to excavation. Texas has two call notification centers. Call 811 at least 48 hours before you plan to excavate!
